Become a governor

Governors are people who want to make a positive contribution to children and young people's education. They make up one of the largest volunteer forces in the country and have an important part to play in raising school standards.

At Diverse Academies, governors form part of our local academy committees, representing diverse backgrounds and experiences. Governors may fit into one of several categories, including parent governors (open to parents, grandparents, and foster carers), staff governors, and governors appointed by the academy committee.

There are no particular qualifications or requirements for becoming a governor other than a willingness to dedicate time to the role, work collaboratively with others, and ensure the best possible outcomes for children.
